
God decides to become nothing in the universe but human. He does not become a star, or a tree, or a dog. When the son takes flesh from Mary, the most intimate connection is made between the divine life and the beautiful human nature every human shares. God does not become what he does not love. God does not become what he hates. God becomes what he makes and this is a love, a solidarity exceeded only by God's willingness to die also for what he makes.

We do not get to the dying though, until we understand the infinite divine love involved in God sharing our contingent, vulnerable flesh. - Kenneth Tanner (Feb 28th 2023 IG post) All theologies that do not marinate in this mystery —the message of embodied divine love that we are trying but failing to articulate will distort the Incarnation and the Cross, will give us a false image of God and a false image of humanity.

What we have in the beautiful, mystery-laden, and diverse openings of Genesis, John, Colossians, and Hebrews is a story of the origin of the cosmos where God is not soliloquy but conversation, not solo but chorus, not alone but a harmony of crucified Love without origin or end.





Of the Father's love begotten Ere the worlds began to be, He is Alpha and Omega, He the source, the ending He

Of the things that are, that have been, And that future years shall see Evermore and evermore.

What does 'only begotten Son' mean?

The Greek term translated "only begotten" is *monogenes*, a word used nine times in the New Testament that can mean **one of a kind or unique**.

For example, Luke uses the term three times to refer to an only child (Luke 7:12; 8:42; 9:38). The writer of Hebrews uses the term to refer to Isaac, the only son of Abraham and Sarah, the son of the promise (Hebrews 11:17).

Does this mean Jesus was somehow born or created by God? It does not. Instead, the emphasis is on Jesus as one in unique relationship with the Father (Jn 1:14, 18).



Yet those who embrace Him, who trust in His name, experience His Light, His I AM setting them free to become their true selves, free to live as children of God in the darkness, discovering their origin beyond their earthly parents in the Word in the Father.

John 1:14 MIRROR

"Suddenly the invisible, eternal Word takes on visible form - the Incarnation on display in a flesh and blood person as in a mirror! In him, and now confirmed in us! The most accurate tangible display of God's eternal thought finds expression in human life!

The Word became a human being; we are his address; he resides in us!

He captivates our gaze! The glory we see there is not a religious replica; he is the authentic begotten son.

The glory (*that we lost in Adam*) returns in fullness! Only grace can communicate truth in such complete context!
